Proclamation

- WHEREAS,** it is estimated that 6.7 million people currently live with chronic wounds and that number is expected to grow at more than two percent annually for the next decade; and
- WHEREAS,** the rising incidence is fueled by an aging population and increasing rates of diseases and conditions such as diabetes, obesity and the late effects of radiation therapy; and
- WHEREAS,** untreated chronic wounds can lead to diminished quality of life and possibly amputation of the affected limb; and
- WHEREAS,** more than 30.3 million people or 9.4 percent of population have diabetes in the United States and almost two million of those people will develop a diabetic foot ulcer or other non-healing wounds; and
- WHEREAS,** advanced wound care aims to prevent amputations and heal patients in a faster and more cost-effective way by physicians and health care providers who take great pride in caring for their patients, and seeing them succeed; and
- WHEREAS,** the goal of Wound Care Awareness Week is to highlight the importance of advanced wound care and its ability to save lives and limbs.
- NOW, THEREFORE,** I, John Bel Edwards, Governor of the State of Louisiana, do hereby proclaim June 4-8, 2018 as

in the State of Louisiana.
